

The Christie at Oldham Follow-up arrangements after radical radiotherapy to the bladder

On your last day of radiotherapy treatment, please make an appointment at the main reception for a **telephone follow-up** in six to eight weeks' time.

After this you will be followed up by your urologist. We will make arrangements for you to be seen by the urology team in **three months** and to have a cystoscopy. You will receive this appointment directly from their hospital.
