1. Introduction and background

The Christie trust **(The Owner)** is required to produce an annual report with regard to the progress on achieving modal shift targets. In accordance with Section 106, for the approval of the planning application, for the Manchester Cancer Research Centre (**The Land**)), the Trust is required to report against an agreed modal shift. This is the tenth report required, on the tenth anniversary of the date of the agreement (12th April 2012).

As part of the agreement for <u>Christies strategic planning framework</u> (SPF) the trust produced a <u>Green Travel Plan</u> to support site development.

The GTP aims to support all site employees in a move away from single occupancy vehicles (SOV). Sustainable travel resources were considerably enhanced and cover the following areas:

- Finance
- Monitoring
- Procedural
- Communication and marketing
- Walking

- Cycling
- Public transport
- Sustainable car use
- Offsite alternatives

The modal shift is based on the following targets for staff using sustainable travel:

- Medium term (2024) 52%
- Long term (2030) 60%

2. Key Highlights 2022/2023

Free cycle maintenance sessions

In partnership with revolveMCR free cycle maintenance servicing sessions have taken place on site each month with the only cost for staff being any parts that may need replaced. A total of sixteen session have taken place throughout the year. The team are able to service 10 bikes each session and sessions have been fully booked up in advance. The ongoing popularity of the sessions has been used to support the introduction of an additional Winter ready session next year.

Cycle compound security enhancements

A review of the cycle compounds took place, and it was identified the three of the compounds would benefit from security enhancements. The compounds polycarbonate sheeting was identified as a design flaw due to the ease of which it could be removed with minimum number of tools. The Trust funded modifications to the compounds and replaced the polycarbonate with metal sheeting.

New public transport discount

The Trust to support the uptake of flexible working has added the Metrolink Clipper to our public transport discounts. Staff who get the Clipper through the Trust will benefits from a 10% discount. The Clipper offer is designed for flexible workers, part-time workers or anyone who travels regularly but not every day. It is hoped this will support staff under flexible working contracts to use public transport when the must attend site.

4. Travel plan and modal Shift

Data to monitor progress on modal shift is obtained annually through a survey of all site users, having been a requirement of the Manchester City Council (MCC) from 2014. Previously only Christie payroll staff members were surveyed, not other site users. The 2013 survey was used to form the baseline against which the GTP is measured which indicated 34.7% of staff members commuted via sustainable travel.

As part of the SPF a modal shift target was agreed with MCC to aim for 60% of staff using sustainable travel by 2030, progress to be monitored using baseline of data from the 2013 staff survey. Data to monitor progress on the modal shift is to be obtained annually through a site wide staff survey.

The tables below indicate the survey figures from 2012 up to the most recent survey in 2022. The current survey indicates 46% of staff members commute via sustainable travel. This modal shift figure includes 10% of staff members working exclusively from home during the pandemic. The Trust will continue to explore the long-term potential for working from home and how this forms part of the modal shift.

The tables below detail the process for conducting the 2022 survey and the results: -
