## The neuroendocrine tumour (NET) specialist nursing service at The Christie

The clinical nurse specialists (CNS) within the NET team act as key workers for patients and provide a point of contact for patients who are undergoing neuroendocrine cancer treatment at The Christie. They provide a link between patients and the oncology team and also provide a link between the hospital and other health care professionals, such as the GP.

A cancer care co-ordinator supports the clinical nurse specialist to deliver quality cancer care to patients who access the NET service. The cancer care co-ordinator provides a single point of access for patients with the aim of optimising patient care.

### What can the key worker provide?

- Specialist nursing assessment and advice about problems you may be experiencing because of the disease or the treatment.
- Comprehensive information about your type of cancer, treatment options, side effects and follow-up care.
- Time to talk through the information you have been given and discuss any concerns.
- Support for you and your family or carers.
- A point of contact when you have questions or concerns between hospital visits.

The service is available for as long as you are under the care of the medical oncology team at The Christie.



## What can the cancer care co-ordinator provide?

- General information and support about cancer and cancer services.
- Navigate patients and relatives/carers to appropriate services.
- Signpost patients and relatives/carers to appropriate services.
- Refer patients and relatives/carers to local and online services and resources to help self-manage.
