Who is the service for?

The CAREGO service supports women with gynaecological cancers that are at an advanced stage. You may be referred to The CAREGO team for specialist support with managing your disease. We can help you at any time before, during or after anti-cancer treatment.

What we offer:

Our aim is to manage your treatment proactively, take care of your symptoms and concerns and ensure that you are cared for at home as much as possible. We will help to coordinate your in-hospital care and community services. Our team will meet you on the wards if you are at The Christie. The service has regular outpatient clinics to facilitate rapid access to assessment and specialist support to manage symptoms and minimise the need for admission to hospital.

How we can support you

Women with advanced gynaecological cancers often experience problems which may include fatigue, bowel dysfunction (nausea, constipation, diarrhoea, early fullness, bloating), fluid in the abdomen (called ascites), pain and emotional distress. Many women will need treatment for these problems requiring medications, procedures and hospital appointments. This can be tiring and time-consuming. CAREGO can help coordinate your care to ensure that you have access to the right treatment in the setting that is most appropriate for your needs.

You can contact our clinical coordinator who will ensure you speak to the right member of our team to address your concerns in a timely manner.

Runs regular outpatient clinics to assess your symptoms and quickly address concerns.

Sarah is the single point of contact for patients and their family or carers and will coordinate access to care in hospital and in your community.

Working together

The CAREGO team works closely with the multidisciplinary team (MDT) in the hospital including:

- Gynaecological medical oncology team (Professor Jayson, Dr Clamp, Dr Hasan and Dr Mitchell)
- Clinical nurse specialists
- Supportive care team
- Nutrition and dietetics team
- Intervention and procedures (IPU) team
- Complex discharge team

We also work with your community-based teams and if you are at another hospital, we will coordinate with them to ensure we support you.
