

Adjuvant bisphosphonate service (ABS) in the treatment of early breast cancer

A guide for patients and their carers

You have been given this leaflet because you have been referred to the adjuvant bisphosphonate service (ABS) and have chosen to start bisphosphonate treatment for your early breast cancer.

The ABS provides treatment in early breast cancer that may reduce the risk of your breast cancer returning. It is given as an intravenous (IV) infusion in the form of a drug called zoledronic acid. This treatment is offered to post-menopausal women or women who are rendered post-menopausal due to drug treatments. The treatment is also offered to men with early breast cancer.

You will have a total of 6 infusions at approximately 6 monthly intervals. We will try to start your bisphosphonate treatment as soon as we have a confirmed consent for treatment, you have seen the dentist to assess your dental health and your vitamin D levels are in the correct range. You may start treatment at the end of chemotherapy if this is possible.

What happens when I have been referred to the service?

Your oncologist will refer you to the service. We will ensure you have been consented to treatment, have adequate vitamin D levels and had a dental check. You may have been given a dental letter that will need to be returned to the ABS by yourself or your dentist. We prefer that the dental letter is emailed. (See contact details overleaf).

The ABS service will then co-ordinate your zoledronic acid infusion with your local intra-venous (IV) team for treatment closer to home. Once a referral has been made by the ABS to the local IV team, they will contact you to make an appointment for your infusions. They will also contact you to organise a blood test to check your kidney function and calcium levels a few days before the infusion is given.
